

- Climate Change Impact




Common Issues on Water Cycle in Asia

OLD: Universities speak to society

- Science as the accumulation of new knowledge as a goal in itself
- Researchers with their own agenda: unrestricted freedom of research; unconditional funding
- Research: unpredictable and unmanageable?



#### Universities and science

### **NEW:** Society talks back

- Societal perspective on science
- To produce new knowledge for practical application with high relevance, utility and economic impacts
- Research is intentional, purposive and manageable
- Responsive to requirements of market
- Funding tied to needs of donors
